Maryland's Community Personal Assistance Services program provides community services and supports to enable older adults and people with disabilities to live in their own homes.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

Maryland residents who need support with activities of daily living, such as bathing, grooming, and dressing.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Medical and Technical Criteria

- Individuals must live in the community, need help with activities of daily living in their homes, and meet the program's medical level of care.

Financial Criteria

- An individual's income and assets are reviewed to determine financial eligibility for community Medicaid.
- Medicaid coverage is for individuals determined to be categorically eligible or medically needy.
- Medicaid coverage is automatically given to individuals receiving certain other public assistance, such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA), or Foster Care.
- A single person can make up to \$16,243 per year and qualify for Medicaid.
